## THE KIELYS OF GALBALLY

Mary Kiely was born in about 1780 of Galbally, County Limerick, Ireland. Her birth pre-dates the start of the Galbally parish register, so her parents are unknown. She married Nicholas Morrissey in about 1805 in Galbally.

- John Kiely, farmer and Margaret Briton of Drumleague had a daughter, Ally, baptized in 1811.
- Patrick Kiely, farmer and Ally Cooke of Corroughderry had a daughter Honora (1810), daughter Anne (1811), and son Thomas (1817).
- William Kiely, farmer and Catty Donnell of Longford had a daughter Bridget baptized in 1810.
- John Kiely, farmer and Bridget Healy of Ballylooby had a daughter Catty baptized in 1811.
- Jerry Kiely, farmer and Catty Henessy of Coroughderry had a son Patrick baptized in 1811.
- William Kiely, farmer and Mary Leahy of Longford had a daughter Nelly (1811) and Mary (1813).

- Darby Kiely, farmer and Catty Cull of Ballynamuddy had a daughter Catty (1811) and Enid (1815).
- Patrick Kiely, farmer married Bridget Quirke in 1813 and had a son James baptized in 1819 of Moor.
- Michael Kiely, farmer and Catty Dwyer of Corrooughderry had a son John baptized in 1812.
- John Kiely, junr and Nelly Ceasy of Longford had a son Thomas baptized in 1813.
- *John Kiely and Betty Heelan had a daughter Honora baptized in 1815.*
- Patrick Kiely, farmer and Mary Brien of Carrigrock had a daughter Anne baptized in 1816.
- Patrick Kiely, farmer and Margaret Fitzgerald of Knockanebrack had a son John in 1816.
- Darby Kiely, laborer and Margaret Connors of Stoneparke had a son Darby baptized in 1819.

"Kiely is an Anglicized form of the Old Gaelic O'Cadhla. The Gaelic prefix O indicated male descendant of, plus the byname Cadhla, meaning graceful or beautiful; hence, descendants of the graceful one. The name in chiefly found in the Munster counties of Waterford, Limerick and Cork." (www.ireland101.com)
