FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF RICHARD AND KATHERINE GASCOIGNE


Richard Gascoigne was christened 20 September 1640 in Warmington, Warwickshire, the son of Richard Gascoigne, yeoman farmer of Warmington. Richard married Katherine. Richard worked as a labourer.

In the Hearth Tax Returns for 1670 for Warmington, three Gascoignes are mentioned. In the document they are listed as Gaskins: *Widow Gaskin, Matthew Gaskin*, and *Richard Gaskin*.

Richard is listed in the 1671 Hearth Tax Returns for Warmington.


Richard Gascoigne in the 1671 Hearth Tax Return for Warmington

Richard died and was buried 15 September 1703 in Warmington.

Katherine died as a widow 17 Jan 1704 in Warmington.

FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF RICHARD GASCOIGNE AND ANNE PETIPHER

Richard Gascoigne was born in about 1610 of Warmington, and was likely the son of John Gascon of Warmington. Richard was a yeoman farmer in Warmington. Richard married Anne Petipher 8 February 1635 in Radway, Warwickshire, a parish about three miles from Warmington.



Marriage record for Richard Gaskin and Anne Petipher in Radway: "Richard Gaskin of Warmington took to wife Anne Petipher of the same parish and the wedding was solemnized the eight day of February by a lawfull license from Litchfield Anno Dom 1633"

Richard was listed in the 1663 Hearth Tax in Warmington, along with Matthew Gascoyne and John Gascoyne. John and Richard were listed next to each other.

Richard died and was buried 2 July 1678 in Warmington.

Richard is mentioned in a document for Warmington in 1657:


"Declaration of uses of rights of common of pasture for 30 sheep and 10 lambs in Warmington, conveyed by indentures dated 30th June 1657 by **Richard Gascoigne of Warmington yeoman**, to the parties listed therein having been recently bought by him from Joseph Draper of Warmington yeoman. The consideration of £35 was put up, to the use that the said pasture should be unstored with sheep, in order that it may be improved, by the following land holders and freeholders in Warmington in proportion to the amount of land they hold:- John Wootton clerk, rector of the parish church, Anthony Pettipher, gent., Richard Claridge, William Claridge, Ezechiel Huggins, Thomas Perkins, Richard Hemminges, Simon Davyes, Richard Judd the elder, James Hemminges, Richard Askill, Richard Rose, Simon Davyes, carpenter, John Hill, William Goodwyn, gent., Richard Coleman, Thomas Bennitt, Thomas Plant, John Perkins, Thomas Perkins, Joseph Draper, Richard Judd the younger, Richard Davyes, Thomas Collins, John Coleman, John Collins, Joane Collins, **John Gascoigne**, Henry Huggins, Robert Harris, and **Richard Gascoigne**. 31st October 1657." Richard and his wife had the following children:

1. John, christened 17 August 1636 of Warmington; married Alice; buried 25 July 1670 in Warmington.

2. Elizabeth, christened 3 February 1637 in Warmington; buried 8 April 1641 in Warmington.

***3. Richard,** christened 20 September 1640.

4. Thomas, christened 11 December 1642 in Warmington.

5. William, christened 1 December 1644 in Warmington.

6. Matthew, christened 12 February 1647 in Warmington; married Elizabeth Tenant 3 January 1677 in Ladbroke, Warwickshire; listed on Hearth Tax Returns in 1671 in Warmington.

Other Gascoignes found in early Warmington records were:


- John Gascoigne, had a daughter Anne christened in 1639 in Warmington.

FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF JOHN GASCON

John Gascon was born in about 1575 of Warmington, the son of John Gascon. He was mentioned in his father's will in 1592. John was in his apprenticeship at the time of his father's death "*he to begyn to occupye when he is out of his prentyshipp & yf it chance ye said john to mary & that then can not agre with my wife then he shall have the neither part of ye house & to build hym a chamber above ye hall yf he wyll & my wife to have to her the one part off ye house". John was old enough to be appointed the sole executor of his father's will.*

John was a witness for the will of William Gardner of Warmington in 1604, so was of an adult age at that time.

John was buried 23 August 1643 in Warmington.



Item I bequeth & geve my whole lyvying to John my eldest son & he to begyn to occupye when he is out of his prentyshipp & yf it chance ye said john to mary & that then can not agre with my wife then he shall have the neither part of ye house & to build hym a chamber above ve hall vf he wyll & my wife to have to her the one part off ve house furder it is my wyll vt yff John have no sone but daughters that he yt lyvyng shall come to Abraham my younger sone Abraham paying to Johns daughters xxli & vf Abraham have no sone it shall remayne to my tow daughters. Item I geve to John one quearne a great chest ye hanels after ye death of my wife. Item I geve to Ales my daughter xli to be paid within a quarter off a year after my death ye same xli to be maid of catell yt be about my ground Item I geve to Abraham xli to be paid at xvi yeares & ye other at xxi also one heifer & tow ewes & two lames ve which heifer & two ewes & lambes he shall have psently after my death. Item I bequeth to Jone my daughter xli to be paid at xvi yeares & also I geve for a heafer at ye same yere off xvi veares & a heifer to be delivered at xx veares & ve said heafer shalbe breed by John my sone & vff it shall chance yt any of my children dye before they come to age that then ther portions shall remayne to ye rest yt be lyvyng. Item I will yt yf John my sone chance to die before his wife that then she shall remayne use of ground her wydowes estate. Item I wyll yt Mr George Rawley & William Collman to be overseers off this my last will. Item I will yt these portions yt do remayne to be paide at ye yeares above named shalbe paid & discharged by John my sone. Item I make John my whole & alone executor. Wyttnes to this wyll John Richardson Richard Collyns Henry Gyles Steaven Draper.
