

FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF JEFFRY AND ANNE GILKES

Baptism record for Jeffry Gilkes in Swalcliffe: "7 Geffry the sonne of Richard Gylkes"


Jeffry died and was buried 11 October 1645 in Swalcliffe.

2. Mary, christened 5 January 1644 in Swalcliffe.




Baptism record for Richard Gilkes in Swalcliffe: "June 25 Richard the sonne of William Gilks"



- 5. **Georg**, christened 28 January 1615 in Swalcliffe.
- 6. Clemence, (female) christened 9 February 1619 in Swalcliffe.
- 7. Timothe, christened 28 May 1621 in Swalcliffe.
- 8. Lucy, christened 15 March 1622 in Swalcliffe.

FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF WILLIAM AND AGNES GILKS


William Gilks was born in about 1555 in Swalcliffe, the son of John and Margaret Gilkes. The Swalcliffe parish register began in 1560, after William was born. The couples having children in the early 1560s were George and Elinor Gilks, with children Mary (1560) and Thomas (1566) christened; Jeffrey and Agnes, with child Thomas (1561), then Jeffrey and Elizabeth, with children Alis (1564) and Jone (1586); and John and Margaret, with child John (1562). Jeffrey left a will in 1586, which did not include a son named William, so Jeffrey is eliminated as a potential father for William. Jeffrey's will included a list of his debts, including one to William, the son of John Gilkes.

William married Agnes in about 1579.

William was mentioned in the will of Jefry Gilkes of Sibford Gower in 1586.

Jefrey left a will in 1586, with a list of his debts at the end of the will:



William died and was buried 1 September 1609 in Swalcliffe.

An inventory of the goodes cattells and chattels of William Gylkes of Sybford Gowre in the pish of Swalklyfe deceased taken and praysed the thirtieth day of September 1609 by William ffaxon, Anthony Gylkes John Gylkes and Henry Soden.



A note at the bottom of the inventory mentioned his widow Agnes "Agneta euis relictes".

- 4. Margaret, christened 29 March 1594 in Swalcliffe.
- 5. Mary, christened 19 September 1596 in Swalcliffe.



FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF JOHN AND MARGARET GILKES


John Gilkes was born in about 1525 of Sibford Gower in Swalcliffe parish. He married Margaret. John may have been the son of Thomas Gilkes, who was taxed as a freeholder in Sibford Gower in the Lay Subsidy of 1525.

Margaret died and was buried 18 December 1590 in Swalcliffe.



Burial record for Margaret Gilks in Swalcliffe: December 18 Margaret Gilks


John died and was buried 25 April 1591 in Swalcliffe.

FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF THOMAS AND MARGARET GILKES

Thomas Gilkes was born in about 1490 of Sibford Gower in Swalcliffe parish. He married Margaret. In 1525 Thomas was assessed as a freeholder in Sibford Gower.

Thomas and Margaret had the following children:

- 1. William, born about 1500, died in about 1566.
- 2. Thomas, died before 24 January 1347.
- *3. **John**, born in about 1525, married Margaret, buried 25 April 1591 in Swalcliffe.

"Between the 16th and 18th centuries a ½-yardland holding in the open fields was not uncommon, but a number of prominent families had built up far larger holdings. The Gilkes family, for instance, 4 members of which were taxed in 1524, gradually increased their wealth". (British History Online: Swalcliffe)

"The families of the parish of Swalcliffe, which until the late 19th century included the parish of Sibford, have three unusual characteristics: The length of their connection with the parish; the number of freeholders that they included; and the vigour with which they thrust out branches from this small remote village all over the Kingdom. The Gilkes family is a good example under all three heads. It was established there as early as 1525, and as will be see probably over a century earlier, and members of the family still live at Swalcliffe and all round the neighborhood.

It is almost certain that **John Gylkes**, or **Jylkes**, master carpenter, belonged to this family. He was first employed by New College on the hall and stable of their rectory of Swalcliffe in 1397-98, and on farm buildings there in 1408-9 and 1412-3, and was therefore very probably a native of the village.

At the Lay Subsidy of 1525 two comtemporary **Thomas Gilkeses** were assessed as freeholders, one as of Sibford Ferris and the other as of Sibford Gower." (Gilkes of Sibford: An Enterprising Yeoman Family; Cake and Cockhorse, Summmer 1966)
