Agnes or Anne Henocke married Adam Freeston in Ladbroke in 1608. There were no Henockes in Ladbroke, but there was a family of Hancocks. Richard Hancock was the only Hancock having children christened in the 1580s.


Richard Hancock was born in about 1550 of Ladbroke, Warwickshire, the son of Thomas Hancock. He married Alice.

Richard and Alice also had a stillborn child:


"A child of Richard and Alice Haycocke being dead borne was buried the xvth daie of November 1599".

Thomas Hancock was made an overseer for his brother William's will in 1561: "And also I ordeyne & make my oversears Wyllm Croke & **Thomas Hacockes** these beyng wytnysses Robert Lakeshere person there Wm Croke with others"



# FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF RICHARD AND JOHANE HANCOCK


Richard Hancock was born in about 1490 of Ladbroke. He married Johane.

Richard died, leaving a will in 1545. An entry is found in the Lichfield & Coventry Will Index for him.

Johane died in 1547, leaving a will:



Will of Johane Hancokkes 28 Apr 1547, dated 27 Jan 1546

In the name of God Amen the xxvij day of January in the yere of our Lord a thousand fyve hundryth fourty & sixe I Johane Hancokkes of Ladbroke [in the countie of Warwick] being sicke in body & thanking my Lord God of gud & perfyte memorye [& remembrance] feryng & dredyng the tyme of deth the sur her of ys [mercy] doe make my last wyll & testament in maner & form herafter folowyng ffyrst I bequeath my soule to Almyghty [God] to owr Ladye Sent Marye & to all the holy company of hevyn and my body to be beryed in the chyrch yard of Alhaylowes of Ladbroke afore sayd. Also I bequethe for my martuarye acordyng to the lawe & custom. Also I bequeth to the hye alter -xij. Also I bequeth to the belles & orgayn - xijd. Also I bequeth to Ladbroke church a stryke of barle. Also I bequeth to the mother church off Lych iiijd. Also I bequeth to evyry of my godchildren ijd. Also, I bequeth to my dowghter Jone Hancokkes my best pane my best plate my best pewter dyshe my best salt seller my beste candylstyke my best schett & a payre of corser schyttes my best tabull cloth my best towel my ambre my best coverled my best pelow my best cofer my russet kyrtyll and xxvjs viijd. Also I bequeth to my daughter Elynor my second pane my second plater my second dysth my second salt seller my second candylstyke my second schett & a payre of hardyn schettes my second tabull cloth my second tabell my second cofer my jade kyrtyll & xxs. The resedewe of my gudes not bequethyd I gyffe unto my ij sonnys Wyllm Hancokkes & Thomas Hancokkes whom I ordyne & make my full executors they to pay my dettes to dispose for theleys of my saule: And I ordyne & make supervisers of thys my last wyll Wyllm Chebsey & Thoms Chebsey. And they to have for theyr laburs eyther of them – xijd. Theyes men beying wytnes Thomas Parytt parsen Wyllm Croke & Ryc Chekley
