




FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF RICHARD HARRIS AND ANNE GUEST







In the name of God Amen: The sixth day of June in the yeare of our Lord God 1614: And in the twelfth yeare of the raigne of our Soveraigne Lord James by the grace of God Kinge of England ffrannce and Ireland defender of the faith &c. And of Scottland the seven and fowrtyth, I William Harrys of Little Comptone in the County of Gloucester husbandman being sick in body but of good and perfect memorie god be thanked therfour doe make and ordeyne this as my last will & testament in manner and forme following. Ffirst I bequeath my soule to all mighty God my sole Saviour and redeemer. And my body to be buried in the churchyard of Little Comptone hoping to have my parte in the resurrection of the Just. As touching my worldly goodes first I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann ffive poundes, on cubbord, on brasse pott which came from Wiginton, on great chest which now standeth at Wiginton at this present. Item I give and bequeath to my sonn William Harrise ffive poundes, on mault mill, on chest now standing in the furthermost chamber. Item I give to my sonn Richard Harrise ffive poundes. Item I give to my eldest brother Richard Harrise at Wiginton my best cloake. All the rest of my goodes and chattles as well moveables as unmoveables my debtes and funerall and legacies discharged I give and bequeath to **Jane** my now espoused wife, whom I doe make my sole executrix of this my last will and testament. Furthermmore my will is that the sayd legaces given and bequeathed to my children (Ann William and Richard Harries) to be payed to them at the age of fowrteene yeares by my executrix, to thayr owen use, and in the mean space she to set it out to use towards theyre maintenance. I request my loving freindes and neighbours William Parsons and Henrie Baylyes of Shewell to be overseers of this my last will and testament, revoking all other former wills whatsoever. And I doe give and bequeath unto them in token of my love vjd a peece. In witnesses wherof I have subscribed my hand to this writing the day and yeare first above written.





Jelian died and was buried 20 November 1563 in Wigginton.





I will same bestowed upon vittalls and bread and drinke xxs the daie that I am buried on. Item I geve unto William Harris the sonne of Richard Harris my sonne my best pott and my best cofer. Item I geve unto everie child of Richard Harris my sonne one sheepe apeece. Item I geve unto Margerye Warren a pott that hath a blacke place in the bothome and a caulderen the largest but one and one sheepe. Item I geve unto Annis Warren my daughter halfe a quarter of barlie and towe stricke of masline. Item I geve unto Peter Goodman my sonne in lawe the largest pott save one and a posnett. Item I geve unto the said Peter a cofer standing by my bed. Item I geve unto Margerie Warren the best hilling. Item a pare of sheettes. Item I geve unto Peter Goodman the bed that I lye on and all that belongethe unto the same. Item I geve unto everie child of William Dolton a posnett. Item I make William Dolton and Richard Harris my executors of this my last will and testament. In witness where of are these persons whose names are here under subscribed. Thomas Evens Humfre Willkes Edward Charles
