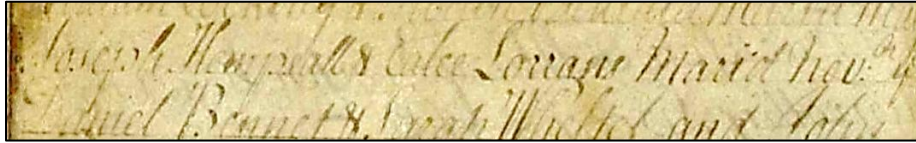


FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF JOSEPH HEMPSSELL AND ALICE LORRANS

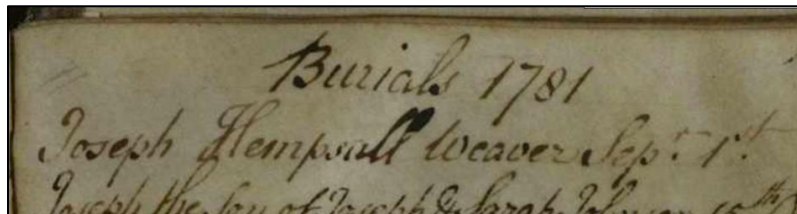

Alice was born in about 1720, most likely the daughter of John and Constance Lawrence of East Markham. Joseph Hemsell was a weaver.



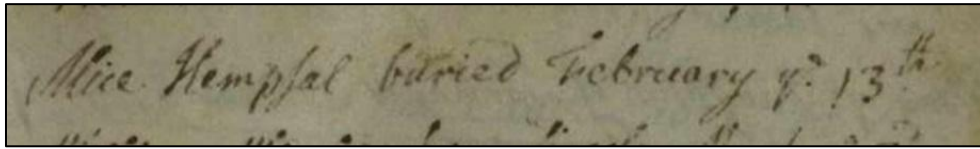

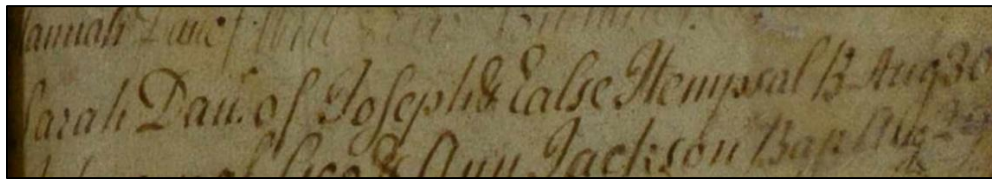
Alice died and was buried 13 February 1773 in East Markham.

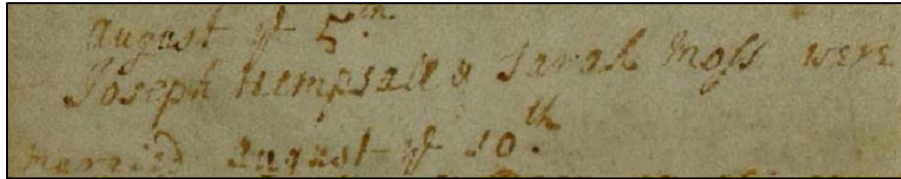

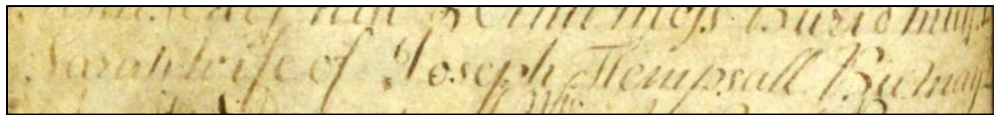

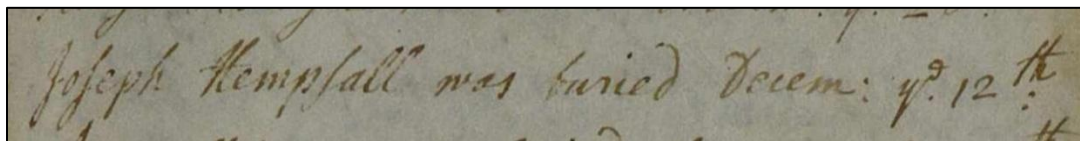
Sarah was christened 25 March 1700 in East Markham, the daughter of John Moss and Sarah Hardy.

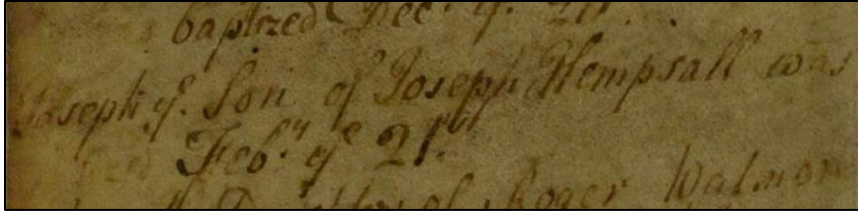
Joseph was buried 12 December 1748 in East Markham.

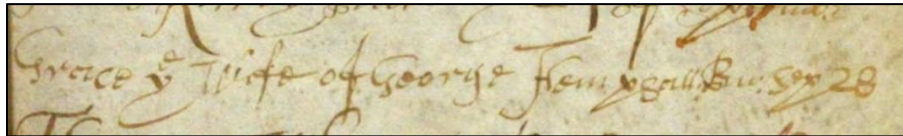

George Hemsall was christened 28 November 1647 in East Markham, the son of Thomas Hemsall and Dorothy Archer. He married 1) Grace Marshall 1 May 1677 in Ossington, Nottinghamshire. George was a husbandman in East Markham.

Grace was christened 21 March 1648 in Ossington, the daughter of Cartwright Marshall and Margaret Smith.

Grace died 28 September 1689 in East Markham.

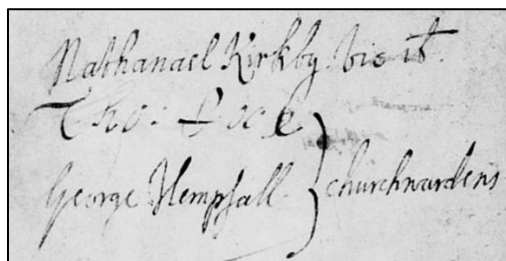

George then married 2) Jane Milnes 16 February 1691 in East Markham.

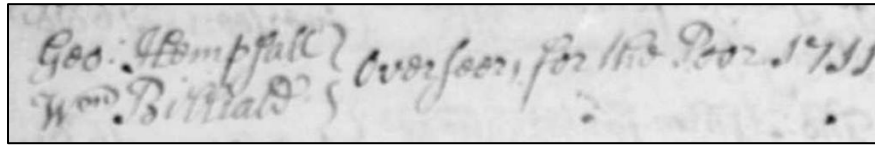

George was a churchwarden in East Markham in 1692.



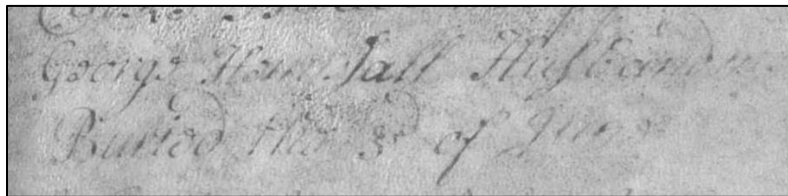

George died and was buried 3 June 1722 in East Markham.



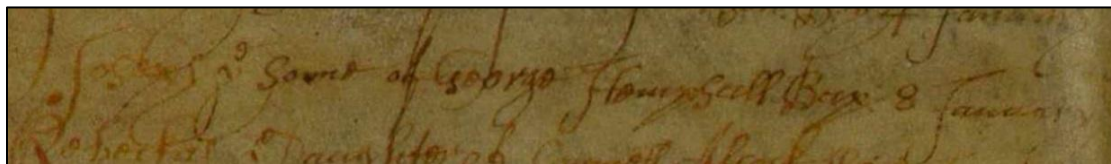

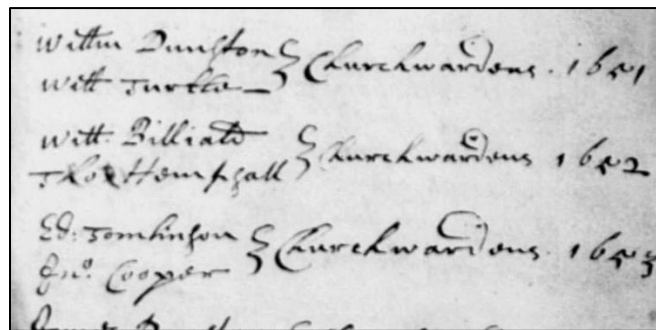

FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF THOMAS HEMSALL AND DOROTHY ARCHER

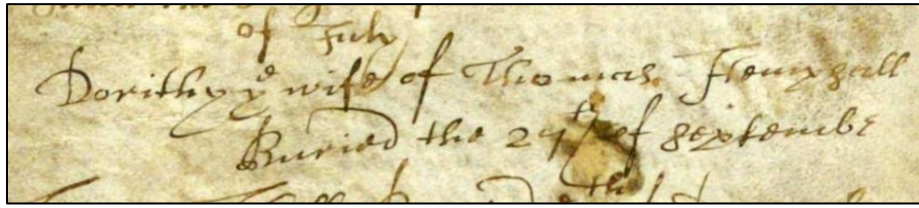

Thomas Hemsall was a churchwarden in East Markham in 1652.



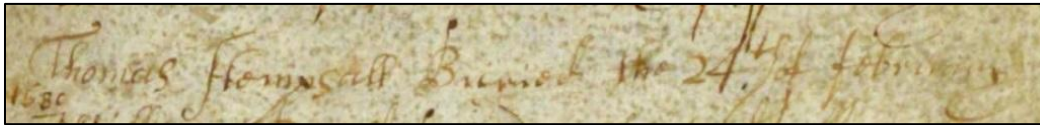

Dorothy died and was buried 27 September 1675 in East Markham.



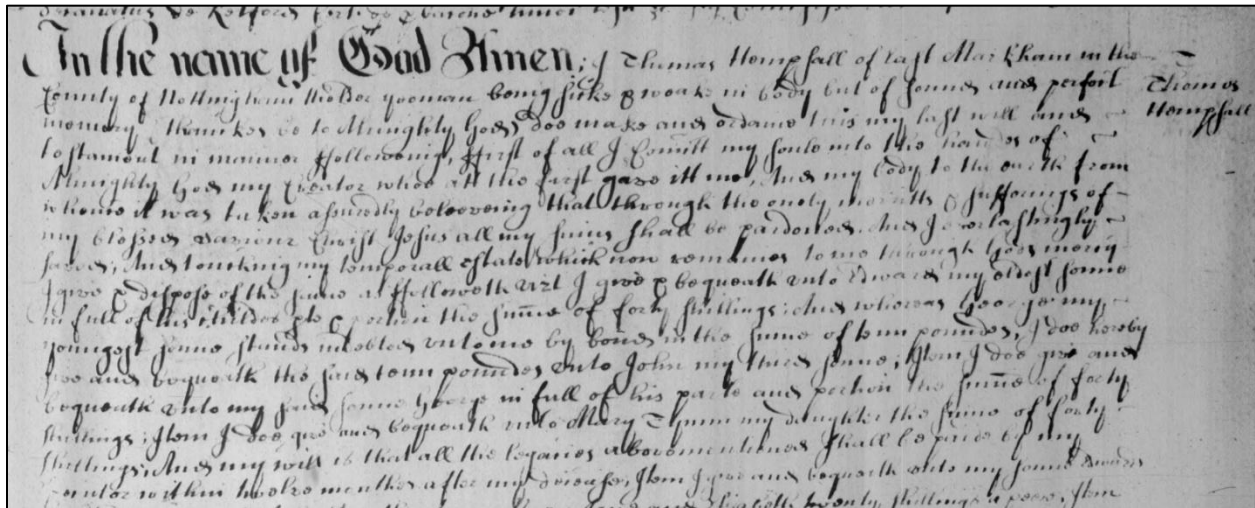

*In the name of God Amen, I **Thomas Hemsall of East Markham** in the county of Nottingham, thelder yeoman, being sicke and weake in body, but of sound and perfect memory, thanks be to Almighty God, doe make and ordaine this my last will and testament in manner following, first of all I comitt my soule into the hands of Almighty God my Creator whoe att the first gave itt me, and my body to the earth from whome it was taken assuredly believing that through the merritts and sufferings of my blessed Savior*

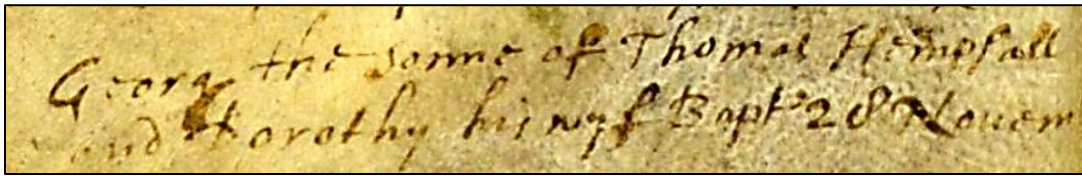
*Christ Jesus all my sins shall be pardoned And I everlastingly be saved; And touching my temporall estate which now remaines to me through God's mercy I give and dispose of the saide as followeth viz: I give and bequeath unto **Edward my eldest sonne** in full of his childe parte & portion in the sum of forty shillings. And whereas **George my youngest sonne** stands indebted unto me by bond in the sune of ten pounds, I doe hereby give and bequeath the said ten pounds unto **John my third sonne**. Item, I doe give and bequeath unto my said sonne George in full of his parte and portion the sune of forty shillings. Item I do give and bequeath unto **Mary Tymm my daughter** the sune of forty shillings. And my will is that all the legacies above mentioned shall be paide by my executors within twelve months after my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto **my sonne Edwards six children namely John Dorothy Ann Mary Jane and Elizabeth** twenty shillings a peece. Item I give and bequeath unto **Jane Knight my grandchild** twenty shillings. Item, I give and bequeath unto **Thomas my grandchild, my sonne John his sonne** the sune of twenty shillings. Item, I give and bequeath unto **my two grandchildren, namely Thomas and Cordelia being my sonne Thomas his children** twenty shillings a peece. Item I give and bequeath unto **my grandchild Mary Tym** the sune of twenty shillings. And my will is that these last mentioned legacies hereby given to my grandchildren shall be paide them by my executor as they shall attain their severall ages of two and twenty yeares. Item, I give and bequeath unto **my said grandchild Thomas my sonne Thomas his sonne** two bed bordes one seiled chest two tables two formes foure buffett stooles, one well trough, one other stone trough and sitting trough And a paire of quernes; Item I give and bequeath unto **my grandchild Thomas my sonne John his sonne** the bedstead and all the bedding and furniture thereunto belonging wheron I now lye in the parlour, and one seiled chest in the parlours And the great long settle in the house. And lastly I doe make, ordaine and appoint **my sonne Thomas** with whome I live sole executor of this my last will and testament to whome I give all other my personall estate not hereby disposed of. In wittnesse whereof I have hereunto putt my hand and seale the fourth day of September Anno Domini Thomas Hempsall*

5. **Thomas**, christened 20 April 1643 in East Markham; had children Thomas and Cordelia; died 1724.
6. **John**, christened 13 April 1645 in East Markham; had sons Thomas (1676), John (1684), Jonathan (1688), George (1690), and Joseph (1695); died 1724.

*7. **George**, christened 28 November 1647 in East Markham; married 1) Grace Marshall 1 May 1677 in Ossington, then 2) Jane Milnes 16 February 1691 in East Markham; buried 3 June 1722 in East Markham.

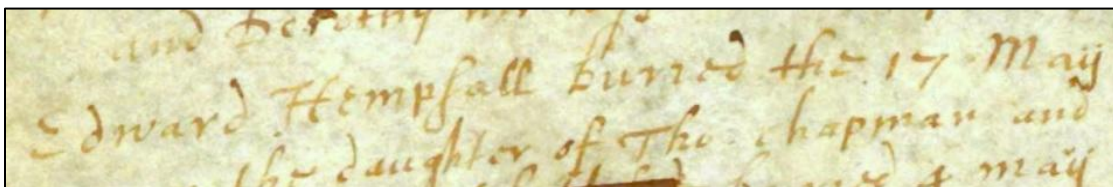

Edward Hemsall was born in about 1579, the son of John and Alice Hemsall. He married 1) Ann in about 1602 of Laxton, Nottinghamshire, then 2) Margaret by 1615. Margaret was mentioned as Edward's wife in the will of his mother, Alice, in 1615. Edward was a wheelwright.

Edward was buried 17 May 1650 in East Markham, leaving a will dated 5 December 1648.

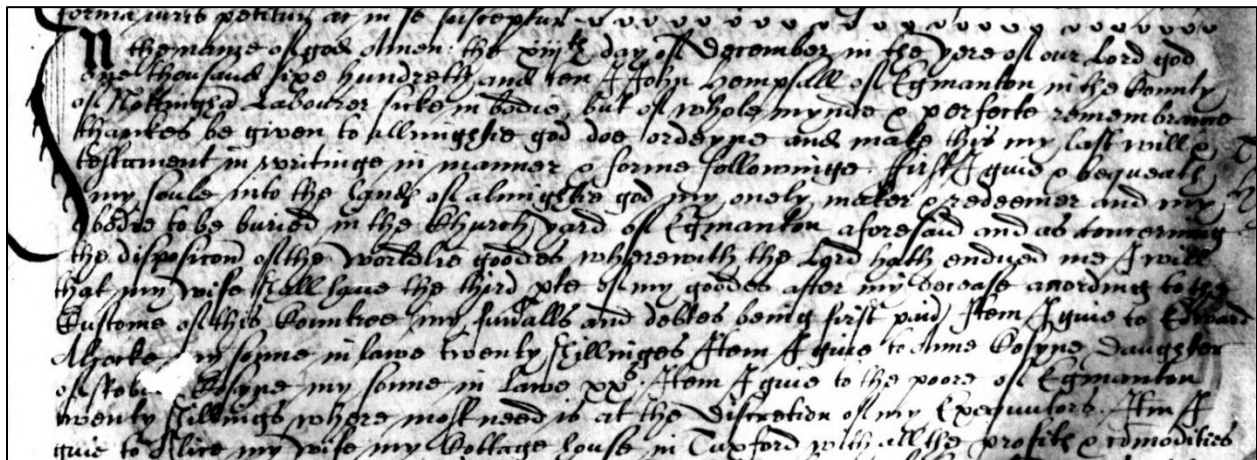

John died in 1611, leaving a will dated 13 December 1610 and probated 11 April 1611.



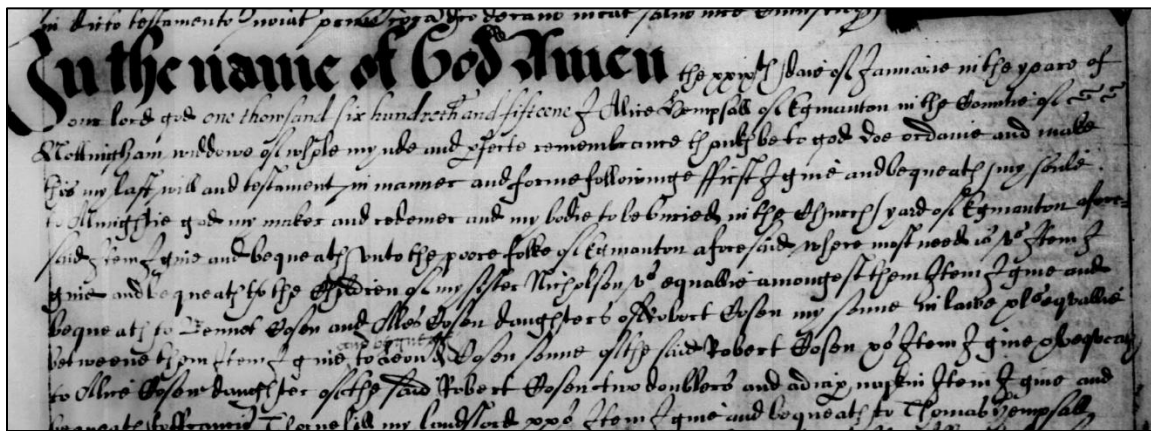
Will of John Hempsall 1610

*In the name of God Amen: the xiiijth day of December in the year of our Lord God one thousand six hundred and ten I **John Hempsall of Egmonton** in the County of Nottingham labourer sicke in bodie, but of whole mynde and perfect remembrance thanks be given to Almighty God doe ordeyne and make this my last will and testament in writinge in manner and forme following: ffirst, I give and bequeath my soule into the hands of Almyghty God my onely maker and redeemer and my bodie to be buried in the churchyard of Egmonton aforesaid and as concerning the disposicon of the wordlie goodes wherewith the Lord hath endued me I will that my wife shall have the third part of my goodes after my decease according to the custome of this countree my funerals and debtes being first paid. Item I give to **Edward Alcocke, my sonne in lawe** twenty shillings. Item I give to **Anne Cosyne daughter of Robert Cosyne my sonne in lawe** xxd. Item, I give to to the poore of Egmonton twenty shillings where most need is at the discretion of my executors. Item I give to **Alice my wife** my cottage house in Tuxford with all the profits*

and comodities thereunto belonging or therewithall occupied for the terms of twenty years with all the rentes thereupon reformed yf she soo longe doe live, and if she dye before the said terms of twenty yeres I give the said cottage house to **Elizabeth Cosyne wife of Robert Cosyne my said sonne in lawe** for the terme of three score years yf she so longe live and if it is fortune that the said Elizabeth dye before the terme of the aforesaid lease of three score yeres then I give the aforesaid cottage house & other premises with the appurtenances to **Edward Hempsall my sonne** his heires executors and assignes all the terms of yeres then to come and unexpired in the same; the said Edward Hempsall his heires executors and assignes paying to **Edward Alcocke my sonne in lawe** five pounds of lawfull money of England within the space of his or their entrie to the same cottage house with the premises &c appurtenances. Item, I give all my apparell to **my said sonne Edward Hempsall and Edward Alcocke** to be parted equally betweene them. The rest of my good and chattells not given nor bequeathed, my debtes, legacies and funeralls discharged I give to **Alice my wife, and Robert Cosyns my sonne in lawe** whom I make my sole and full executors of this my last will and testament.

Alice died in 7 February 1615 in Egmanton. She left a will dated 29 January 1615, and probated 15 April 1616.

In the name of God Amen the xxixth daie of Januaire in the yeare of our Lord God one thowsand six hundreth and fiftene, I **Alice Hempsall of Egmanton** in the Countie of Nottingham widdowe of whole mynde and perfecte remembrance thanks be to God doe ordaine and make this my last will and testament in manner and forme following ffirst, I give and bequeath my soule to Almighty God my maker and redemer and my bodie to be buried in the churchyard of Egmanton aforesaid. Item I give and bequeath unto the poore folke of Egmanton aforesaid where most need is vs Item I give and bequeath to **the children of my sister Nicolson vs equallie amongst them**. Item I give and bequeath to **Bennet Cosen and Alles Cosen daughters to Robert Cosen my sonne in lawe xls equallie betweene them**. Item I give and bequeath to **Leonard Cosen sonne of the said Robert Cosen xs**. Item I give and bequeath to **Alice Cosen daughter of the said Robert Cosen two doublers and a diaper napkin**. Item I give an bequeath to **Ffrancis Thornehill my landlord xxs**. Item I give and bequeath to **Thomas Hempsall the sonne of**

Edward Hemsall my sonne xxs. Item I give and bequeath to Peter Allicocke the sonne of Edward Allicocke my sonne in lawe xxs. Item I give and bequeath to Edward Allicocke and to Katherine his wife vli. Item I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Cosen wife of the said Robert Cosen xs and a boulster a great chest a matterice and a fryeinge panne. Item I give and bequeath to Edward Hemsall my sonne ffower pounds. I give and bequeath to Margaret Hemsall wife of the aforesaid Edward Hemsall one reed petticoate and a hempen sheete. Item I give Jone Hemsall daughter of the said Edward Hemsall one pewter doubler and one little arke. Item I give to Elizabeth Allicocke daughter of the said Edward Allicocke one brasse pott. Item I give and bequeath to Jone Allicocke daughter of the said Edward Allicocke one quilt and one blankett. Item I give and bequeath to Katherine Allicock daughter of the said Edward Allicocke one hempen sheete a pillowbeare and a candlesticke. Item I give to Katherine Allicocke wife of the said Edward Allicocke a coverlitt a lynninge sheete and a little panne. Item I give to Katherine Allicocke and Elizabeth Cosen my daughters all the rest of my apparel. And it is my wish that the said Robert Cosen my sonne in lawe shall have the yeare of the lease that I have in my howse yet for to come. The rest of all my goods and chattels not given nor bequeathed my debts legacies and funerals discharged I give and bequeath to Edward Hemsall my sonne whome I make my lawfull executor of this my last will and testament.
