
FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF RICHARD AND ELIZABETH COWPER

Richard Cowper or Cooper was christened 12 May 1628 in the parish of Duffield, Derbyshire, the son of Richard Cowper and Anna Bilby. The name is usually recorded as Cowper in the 1600s, changing to Cooper in the late 1600s and early 1700s. It is sometimes recorded as *Cowp* or *Cowpe*, using an old abbreviation with the letter *P* having the descending part of the *p* with a horizontal cross which stood for "per" or "par".

Richard married Elizabeth in about 1646, and they settled in the town of Shottle. Richard was a yeoman farmer.

Richard was mentioned in Duffield Manor Court records in 1650 in Shottle and Posterne. The record included Richard Cooper, Robert Shipley and William Bramley. They "do owe suit to ye Court of Mannors aforesd and have not appeared at this Court Ideo every one of them is amerced". Amerced means fined for not appearing at the court.



Two years later, in 1652, Richard Cooper and Robert Shipley were again fined for not appearing at the manor court.






Will of Richard Cooper of Shottle, 1682


In the name of God Amen I Richard Cooper of Shotle in the County of Derby yeoman being in good health and of sound and perfecte memorie praised bee God doe make constitute ordaine and appointe this my last will and testament in manner and forme following/That is to say, first and principally I commend my soule to Almighty God hopeing through the meritts death and passion of my saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon and forgiven of all my sinnes and inherite eternall life and my bodie I commit to the Earth to bee buried at the dispositon of such temporall estate as it hath pleased God to bestowe upon mee I give and dispose thereof as followes: And first I give and bequeath unto my eldest sonne George Cooper the best horse or mare I shall bee possed of at the tyme of my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto my sonne Humprey Cooper the summe of ffifty poundes to bee paid him by my executrix here after named within one yeare nexte after my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Cooper the summe of threescore poundes to bee paid her by my executrix here after named within one year nexte after my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anne Shipley wife of John Shipley one shilling. Item I give and bequeath unto my loveing wife Elizabeth Cooper my two farmes or liveings which I am possessed of within Shotle and hould by lease under the right honorable William Earle of Devonshire the one called the holly seales and the other called the neither farme for and during the remainder of the terme which I have therein if shee the said Elizabeth shall soe longe be. Item My will and mind is and I doe hereby give and bequeath unto my sonne Thomas Cooper from and after the decease of my said loveing wife Elizabeth Cooper the possession of my farme or tenement in Shotle aforesaid called holly seale and the remainder of the said terme therein if any shall bee after the decease of my said lo: wife. Item my will and mind is and I doe hereby give and bequeath unto my sonne Samuell Cooper from and after the decease of my lo: wife Eliz Cooper the passion of my farme or tenement in Shotle aforesd called neither farme. And the remainder of the said terme therein if any shall bee after the

decease of my sd lo: wife. Item all the rest of my goodes chattels cattelles and personal estate whatsoever I give and bequeath unto my said loveing wife Eliz: Cooper. And I doe hereby nominate and appointe the sd Eliz: Cooper my wife sole executrix of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills and testaments by mee heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seale the seaventh day of January in the three and thirtieth yeare of the raigne of his majestie that now is Anno Dom 1682.


FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF RICHARD COWPER AND ANNA BILBY

Richard Cowley "of Houlbrook" was born in about 1600, the son of Humphrey and Elizabeth Cowper of Shottle. He married Anna Bilby 5 November 1627 in Duffield.

"Matr: Richard Cowpre of Houlbrook and Anna Bilby of Makney were maried ye 5th day"


Richard died and was buried 23 July 1670 in Duffield.



FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF HUMPHREY AND ELIZABETH COWPER

Humphrey Cowper was born in about 1570 of Shottle of Duffield, the son of John Cowper. Humphrey married Elizabeth.

Humphrey was named in Duffield manor court records in the early 1600s.


Humphrey was a constable in Duffield in 1604.

Humphrey Cooper was a witness for the will of William Potter of Duffield in 1610.


Humphrey was mentioned in Duffield Manor Court Records in 1625.

This record lists those to appear in the manor court from the towns of Posterne and Shottle, including Robertus Shipley and Humfridi Cowper

Humphrey was listed in a manor court record in 1629, at the death of John Cowper. John was a hereditary tenant in the town of Holland in Duffield. At his death his estate owed a heriot to the lord of the manor. A heriot was a tribute owed to the lord of the manor, usually a farm animal. Humphrey was named as the son and heir of John's tenancy: "Humfrus Cowper est euis filius et here". The document was written in Latin.




Duffield Manor Court Record, 1629

Humphrey was named in another court record in Latin in 1629, along with his sons George, John, and Richard: "George Cowper filius", "Johis Cowper filius," and "Ricd Cowper filius". The document seems


to be a transfer of the land and cottage in Holland, inherited from Humphry's father John a year earlier, to George. The document also named Humphrey's wife Elizabeth: "Ad hoc curiam venit Humphrus Cowper et Elizabeth ux" - To this court came Humphrey Cowper and Elizabeth his wife.

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


Duffield Manor Court Record, 1629


Humfrey Cowper of Holland and Shottle was mentioned in a Duffield court record in Latin.



FAMILY GROUP RECORD OF JOHN COWPER


John Cowper was born in about 1540 of Duffield.

In 1604 John appeared in the Duffield Manor Court Records when he was fined four shillings for hedgebreaking. This was the cutting and taking of branches from a hedge, likely for fuel.

John died and was buried 13 May 1629 in Duffield.

- Robart Cowper was an appraiser for the inventory of John Robynson of Duffield in 1580.
- Robert Cowper was an appraiser for the inventory of Nicholas Hall of Duffield in 1582.
- William Cowper of Holbrook was buried 8 December 1589 in Duffield.
- William Cowper was listed as a juror in Duffield Manor Court Records in 1598.
- **Robert Cowper** of Hyslewood and **Richard Cowper** of Makeney were listed as customary tenants in Duffield Manor Court Records in 1598.
- William Cowper and Robert Cowper were listed as customary tenants in Holbrook in Duffield Manor Court Records in 1604.
- Elizabeth Cowper of Duffield was buried 17 January 1605 in Duffield.
- William Cowper of Holbroke was buried 7 December 1605 in Duffield.
- Elizabetha Cowper of Duffield, widow, was buried 1 December 1607 in Duffield.
- **Joane** the wife of **Robert Cowper** was buried 27 April 1620 in Duffield.
- **Robert Cowper** was buried 21 September 1626 in Duffield.
